Parents are always welcome on fieldtrips. However, it is school policy that siblings may not accompany parents on these fieldtrips. Parents will need to complete a Volunteer Application Form prior to attending any field trips. Please be aware that parents will be expected to supervise students. All parents, therefore, must be willing to comply with the field trip rules stated by the teacher, as well as any general school policies. Parents who encounter behavior problems should refer students to teacher for necessary disciplinary action.

Excused and Unexcused Absence and Tardy Procedures

All children who have been absent, must return to school with a note (explaining their absence) in order to return to class. A written request is required for all pre-planned absences and must be approved by Mr. Cushing at least one-week in advance.

Unexcused absences:

- Family vacation
- Trips to Disneyland
- Family visiting from out of town-etc.

Remember, ALL requests must be in writing with at least one-week advance notice. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Excused absences:

- Illness
- Death in the family
- Medical or Dental emergency

All students arriving at school after 8:30 am are considered late and must go to the office for an admittance slip. ***An adult must accompany late students to the office.***
